>**Lausanne:**

Recreational activities and visits will be proposed to the participants. Lausanne, Switzerland's fifth biggest city, is situated on the banks of Lake Geneva, the largest in central Europe, in an exceptional setting facing the Alps and enjoys timeless natural scenery. From Geneva airport it takes 30 minutes to access Lausanne. Most of the European capitals are connected by flights in less than 2 hours.

The region of Lake Geneva has a tradition for excellence in the fields of training and research. The Swiss Federal Institute of Technology and the Universities of Geneva, Lausanne, and Neuchâtel form one of the most important scientific and technological centres in the world.

Culturally, Lausanne's reputation largely surpasses the size of the city. Lausanne is the base of Maurice Béjart Ballet. Lausanne has its opera, theaters, musical ensembles and its film library. Numerous festivals and artistic performances take place in the region. Among them, the World-famous Montreux Jazz Festival features every summer music legends and talents. Lausanne has also 19 museums, including the world's only Olympic Museum.

For 80 years the histories of Lausanne and the International Olympic Committee (IOC) have been closely linked. Over 20 international sport federations have established their headquarters in the region, including the Association of Summer Olympic International Federations. The city hosts the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) which plays the same role in the Olympic world as the International Court of Justice at The Hague.

And last but not least, Lausanne hosts the World Sport Forum, the most important independent conference for the global world of sports. Dates of next edition: September 21st-23rd, 2003.
